Sustainability and competition law – where are we today?

Global digital markets and artificial intelligence: a regulatory race?

Competition law and labour markets

Enforcement against anti-competitive hiring practices is now firmly established as a global trend. The UK's Competition and Markets Authority (CMA) recently published a research report on competition and market power in labour markets. The CMA currently has three ongoing investigations concerning labour markets (including broadening an existing cartel investigation

to cover alleged unlawful no-poaching arrangements) and, like a number of agencies worldwide, has declared competition law enforcement in labour markets to be a priority. Our panel will provide an update on global developments and consider the practicalities. Should agencies characterise 'no poach' agreements as per se violations? How can in-house counsel work with human resources (HR) teams to ensure their conduct does not cross the line?
