Jack Batievsky Scholarship

The Latin American Regional Forum of the International Bar Association (IBA), the world's largest organisation of Law Societies, Bar Associations and individual lawyers engaged in transnational law, will hold its Biennial Conference in Bogota, Colombia from 14–16 March 2012.

Lawyers from the region and general counsel from leading companies in Latin America will discuss the challenges of practising law in difficult times and environments, where the balance between the preservation of existing investments and the encouragement of new ones must be established.

The Latin American Regional Forum of the IBA will award the scholarship to a young lawyer practising in Latin America who wishes to participate in this conference but is unable to do so owing to financial constraint.

The IBA therefore invites interested persons to apply for a scholarship, which will cover registration fees and provide a contribution towards travel and accommodation.

Background – Jack Batievsky Scholarship

When Jack Batievsky passed away suddenly in early December 2002, the International Bar Association lost a dear friend and colleague. Jack, a dedicated professional and extremely well regarded lawyer, contributed tremendously to the development of the International Bar Association. For a number of years, he was the representative of the Colegio de Abogados de Lima to the IBA Council, and was the Chair of the Section on Business Law's Professional Development Committee and the Latin American and Caribbean Forum, organising several training courses for young lawyers and a successful Conference in Cuzco, Peru in 2002.

The application must be accompanied by a 8,000-9,000 word paper in English on the following topic:

- **Dispute between states and particulars. A disincentive for investment.**

The conflicts between states and particulars have been increasing in the past years. One of the factors that has increased such conflicts has been the lack of fulfillment by the government of their commitments and the expropriation of privately owned companies. The purpose of this paper is to examine in depth the different mechanisms adopted by the different government states in order to solve problems between states and particulars and the success of such mechanisms.

Applications received by **MONDAY 6 FEBRUARY 2012** will be submitted to the scholarship committee. Applications will be reviewed and the winner will be decided by the Latin American Forum Scholarship Committee.

Criteria

- (1) The Latin American Regional Forum Scholarship to attend the Biennial IBA Latin American Regional Forum Conference - Latin America: challenges and developments in a time of opportunities from 14–16 March 2012 is free to enter. It is open to all lawyers up to and including the age of 35 who practise in a Latin American country whether or not they are members of the IBA.
- (2) Applications should be sent by e-mail or fax to Suzana Su, Membership & Conferences Administrator at the IBA Latin America office (suzana.su@int-bar.org).
- (3) Applications should be written in English and be accompanied by a 8,000-9,000 word paper on: **'Dispute between state and particulars. A disincentive for investment.'**
Papers must be original, unpublished works. They will not be under consideration for any Commercial Contract by any publishing house. The author is warranting his/her restricted copyright to the paper submitted.
- (4) Applications must be submitted and received by **Monday 6 February 2012**. Applications received after this time will not be considered.
- (5) All applications will be submitted to the Scholarship Committee which will consist of members of the Latin American Regional Forum. They will judge the papers primarily on the basis of legal argumentation, research, style, logic, originality and overall quality of the content.
- (6) It is planned that the IBA Office will communicate the conference selection panel decision to the successful applicant by **Friday 17 February 2012**.
- (7) The decision of the judging committee is final and no correspondence will be entered into. The decision will be published on the IBA website. The successful applicants will be contacted at the e-mail address given on the application form.
- (8) The Scholarship Award includes:
 - Free registration for the Biennial IBA Latin American Regional Forum Conference - Latin America: challenges and developments in a time of opportunities, 14–16 March 2012, Bogota, Colombia
 - A contribution towards travel and accommodation costs to the conference.

- (12) Please note if you are awarded the Latin American Regional Forum Scholarship you will be required to confirm your attendance by providing a copy of your travel documents for your flight to Colombia and visa (should you need to apply for one). These documents must be sent to Suzana Su (suzana.su@int-bar.org) by **Friday 2 March 2012**.
- (13) The IBA and the Latin American Regional Forum has the right to publish a selection of the papers submitted, including but not limited to the winning paper (either the full text or extracts thereof) up to 18 months after the competition has ended; this includes but is not limited to the publication in the conference documentation and/or on the IBA website and/or other IBA publications. In any event, the name of the author will be indicated appropriately. Authors shall include a biographical note giving details of their legal career, studies and professional appointments. Papers received that are not in this form may not be considered.
- (14) If you are awarded the Latin American Regional Forum Scholarship please note that you may be required to provide a certificate of your proficiency in English (if English is not your first language) and evidence that you are able to practise law.
- (15) The successful candidate shall be required to write a brief report of the conference attended (max 1000 words) and shall submit such report to Suzana Su (suzana.su@int-bar.org) no later than one month after the conference.
- (16) The paper submitted by the winning candidate will be published in the IBA Latin American Regional Forum newsletter and on its webpage. Also in the electronic version of the Latin Lawyer and the winner will be mentioned in the Latin Lawyer briefing.
- (17) Participants will be expected to have read and accepted all the above rules.
