CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

OF

INTERNATIONAL BAR ASSOCIATION FOUNDATION, INC.

UNDER SECTION 402 OF THE NEW YORK NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATION LAW

The undersigned, being a natural person over the age of eighteen, desiring to form a corporation pursuant to the provisions of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of New York, does hereby certify:

- 1. The name of the corporation is INTERNATIONAL BAR ASSOCIATION FOUNDATION, INC. (hereinafter referred to as the "Foundation").
- 2. The Foundation is a "corporation" as defined in subparagraph (a)(5) of Section 102 of the New York

 Not-for-Profit Corporation Law, and shall be a Type B

 corporation within the meaning of Section 201 of the

 Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.
- 3. The Foundation is organized exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law). Within the foregoing, the Foundation's purposes are as follows:

- a) To promote, foster and provide education on law, including, without limitation, international and comparative law, and topics having legal significance or bearing on the administration of justice;
- b) To study, advance and facilitate the administration of justice in the United States and throughout the world;
- c) To promote, foster and aid the development of primitive or developing legal systems;
- d) To promote, foster and advance the right, in the United States and throughout the world, of public access on a non-discriminatory basis to justice and law, and the right and ability of lawyers to practice their profession freely and without interference;
- e) To promote the non-partisan study and research of legal problems and issues and to disseminate the results of such studies and research on a non-discriminatory basis or other basis directed to the public benefit, and to hold seminars or other educational programs in furtherance of the same:
- f) To acquire, preserve and maintain books, documents and other objects or materials concerning the law or having legal significance or bearing on the administration of justice including, without limitation, such materials as may not be generally available, and to act as a repository for the same; and

- g) To conduct any and all other activities as shall from time to time be found appropriate in connection with the foregoing and as are lawful for not-for-profit corporations.
- 4. In furtherance of the foregoing purposes, the Foundation shall have all of the general powers enumerated in Section 202 of the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law together with the power to solicit grants and contributions for any corporate purpose and the power to maintain a fund or funds of real and/or personal property for any corporate purpose. The Foundation shall have the right to exercise such other powers as now are, or hereafter may be, conferred by law upon a corporation organized for the purposes hereinabove set forth or necessary or incidental to the powers so conferred, or conducive to the furtherance thereof.
- 5. The Foundation shall be empowered to solicit funds from the general public.
- 6. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Certificate, the Foundation is organized exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes as specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as the same may be amended from time to time, and shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation described in Section 501(c)(3) of, and exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of, the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.

- 7. Nothing herein shall be construed as authorizing the Foundation, directly or indirectly, to engage in or include among its purposes any of the activities for which approval must be obtained from the commissioner of social services, the commissioner of health, the superintendent of insurance, the cemetery board, or any other authority mentioned in subsections (b) through (u) of Section 404 of the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law. Nothing herein shall authorize the Foundation to operate or maintain an institution of higher learning on the grant degrees.
- 8. The Foundation is not formed for pecuniary profit or for financial gain, and no part of its assets, income or profits shall be distributed to or inure to the benefit of its members, trustees or officers or of any private person; provided, however, that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Foundation in furtherance of one or more of its purposes.
- 9. No substantial part of the activities of the Foundation shall be devoted to carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except to the extent authorized by Section 501(h) of the United States Internal Revenue Code, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law, during any fiscal year or years in which the Foundation has chosen to utilize the benefits authorized by that statutory provision) and the Foundation shall not participate in or

intervene (including the publishing or distributing of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

- In the event of the dissolution of the Foundation 10. or the winding up of its affairs, the assets and property of the Foundation remaining after the payment of expenses and the satisfaction of all liabilities shall be distributed as determined by the Board of Trustees of the Foundation, subject to the approval of a Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of New York upon application of the Board of Trustees, exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, testing for public safety, literary and/or educational organizations as shall then qualify under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as the same may be amended from time to time. Any of such assets and property not so distributed shall be disposed of for such purposes as directed by a Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of New York or such other court having jurisdiction over the Foundation.
- private foundation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, the Foundation shall distribute its income for said period at such time and in such manner so as not to subject it to tax under Section 4942 of said Code; and the Foundation shall not (a) engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d)

of said Code; (b) retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of said Code; (c) make any investments in such manner as to subject the Foundation to tax under Section 4944 of said Code; nor (d) make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of said Code.

- 12. The office of the Foundation within the State of New York shall be located in the County of New York. The Foundation may have such other offices as it may from time to time deem necessary or advisable.
- in a Board of Trustees the number of members of which shall be fixed from time to time by the By-Laws of the Foundation, provided, however, that at no time shall the number of members of the Board of Trustees be fixed at less than three (3). CERTIFICATE OF AMENDMENT OF THE CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF INTERNATIONAL BAR ASSOCIATION FOUNDATION, INC.

Under Section 803 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law

FIRST: The name of the corporation is International Bar Association Foundation, Inc. (the "Corporation").

SECOND: The Certificate of Incorporation of the Corporation was filed by the Department of State on September 18, 1986 with the consent of the Department of Education.

THIRD: The Corporation was formed under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.

FOURTH: The Corporation is a corporation as defined in subparagraph (5) of paragraph (a) of Section 102 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.

FIFTH: This Certificate of Amendment of the Certificate of Incorporation was duly authorized by an Action of Voting Members in Lieu of a Meeting executed by all of the Members of the Corporation.

SIXTH: Prior to delivery of the Certificate of Amendment of the Certificate of Incorporation to the Department of State for filing, there will be endorsed upon or annexed to the Certificate of Amendment of the Certificate of Incorporation the consent of the New York State Education Department and the approval of the New York Attorney General; no other approvals or consents are necessary for the filing of this Certificate of Amendment of Certificate of Incorporation.

SEVENTH: The second sentence of Paragraph 3 of the Certificate of Incorporation regarding the purposes of the Corporation is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Specifically, the Foundation is organized and shall at all times be operated solely to (a) support the charitable and educational undertakings of the International Bar Association (the "IBA") and its rule of law and related projects; (b) solicit and raise funds for individuals, businesses, foundations and other charitable organizations to support the IBA rule of law and related projects; (c) educate the public regarding the IBA rule of law and related projects and regarding the importance of the rule of law; and (d) do all things necessary for and incidental to the accomplishment of the purposes and goals of the Foundation.
