Terms and conditions

- 1. The SEERIL Scholarship for Energy and Natural Resources Law Studies is open to all students free of charge.
- 2. Students may only submit one application. Employees of the IBA or officers of any IBA entity/ committee, and family members of IBA employees and officers are excluded from entering. Previous recipients of the SEERIL Studies Scholarship are also excluded from entering.
- 3. Applications will be assessed primarily on the basis of the following: the extent to which the studies involve energy and natural resources law research; the credentials of the student, illustrated on the basis of previous study result and letter(s) of recommendation; and the need of the student.
- 4. Applicants must complete the online application form before the deadline of midnight British Summer Time (BST) on Sunday 7 April 2024. In addition to this, uploading four documents. The four accompanying documents must comprise:
 - A document detailing the results of your previously completed examinations
 - A letter of recommendation from a senior member of your institution, professor or equivalent
 - Your written statement detailing why you require funding and the reasons for selecting your chosen course
 - Your curriculum vitae (cv)

Your documents must be named using the following format:

Family name_First name_Document contents.

All documents must be uploaded as Microsoft Word files or PDF files.

- 5. Applications received after midnight British Summer Time (BST) on **Sunday 7 April 2024** will not be considered.
- 6. The goal of the IBA Office will be to communicate the Scholarship Committee's decision to applicants by the end of **June 2024**.
- 7. The decision of the Scholarship Committee is final and no correspondence will be entered into. The decision will be published on the IBA website. The successful applicant will be contacted at the email address given on the online application.
- 8. Neither the IBA, the Scholarship Committee, nor the organisers of the scholarship are responsible for your costs in preparing an application, nor for its loss, damage or non-arrival.
- 9. Those students receiving a scholarship will be required to acknowledge the IBA/SEERIL in all study results published as a result of the scholarship, such as papers or articles. The AAG may ask the holder of the scholarship to participate in selected conferences.
- 10. Students receiving a scholarship will be expected to submit progress reports at quarterly intervals to the IBA. At the discretion of the Scholarship Committee, a scholarship may be awarded on an instalment basis, and instalments beyond the first may be conditional upon the receipt of satisfactory progress reports.
- 11. All applicants will be deemed to have read and accepted all the above rules.
